THEME: Resilience Through Recognition – Learning from Our History

Every year our first call to action is to choose a cause that will help to both benefit our communities and make them safer. This year we have chosen to organize, host and run a School/Campus Safety Symposium.

Our 2-day School/Campus Safety Symposium will focus on safety in our private and public schools. We will also incorporate training for school nurses, local law enforcement, local school administrators, teachers, school staff and mental health professionals. Our School/Campus Safety Symposium will be open to the public, and to anyone who is interested in learning about what to do to help stop these types of events and how to survive these events regardless of the venue.

8. First hand Lessons Learned from the first responders and those who stopped the attack on the Santa Monica, California Jr. College Active Shooter.

9. Lessons learned from the first responders of the Sandy Hook School Newtown, Connecticut Active Shooter.

10. First hand lessons learned from the survivors of the Las Vegas Sniper
